<b>Scope / Objective of the scheme including major interventions</b>	Shahjehan Mosque is a master piece of archeological monuments of Sindh. With the passage of time the condition of the mosque is deteriorating which needs to be improved. Therefore, for the sake of its rehabilitation, renovation and preservation the scheme is introduced which aims to improve the garden, mosque and related parts of it.

## **Scope / Objective**
