**MID YEAR REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENT SCHEMES**  
**DROUGHT RECOVERY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME PROJECT**  
**(DRAPP/DERA-II)**

In view of the continuity of drought conditions and the left over areas which could not be covered under DERA-I Programme, the DRAPP/DERA-II Programme at a total cost of Rs.30,000.00 million covering all the provinces & Areas was approved by the ECNEC in its meeting held on December 14, 2005. The province of Sindh was earmarked Rs. 7650.00 million for 5 years of the programme against which the Federal Government has so far released funds to the tune of Rs.1078 million upto June 2008. The Federal Government has earmarked RS.1500.00 million in PSDP 2008-09, out of which Rs. 382.500 million share of Sindh has not yet been released.

The 1<sup>st</sup> Batch (Priority –I) of 168 schemes costing Rs. 331.692 million of 23 Districts of Sindh Province ( as per details attached ) was approved by Federal Steering Committee (FSC) , Islamabad , out of which 128 schemes costing Rs.202.5915 million stands completed as on June 2008. The rest of 40 schemes costing Rs.123.693 million which were started during financial year 2007-08 are under execution and will be completed during January 2009 to June 2009 .

The position of Sector wise Schemes approved under Batch-I 2007-08 in 23 Districts is appended below :-

The PSC in its 10<sup>th</sup> meeting held on November 29, 2008 cleared (47) schemes costing Rs.324.107 million for onward transmission to Federal

Government for its clearance. These schemes will be started once the Federal Government extends the approval. Furthermore, (41) schemes costing Rs.217.161 million are under process / scrutiny and will be placed before PSC shortly so that the same could also be executed and completed during current financial year 2008-09.

All these schemes have been identified by involving the community at grass root level and prepared by the District Governments in consultation with the Public / Elected representatives as such are very much viable and beneficial for the community. Since these schemes are specifically targeted to drought affected areas, therefore, to provide urgent relief to the communities suffering from drought & calamities, based on short / medium term strategy preference was given to the schemes covering the social sectors like Road, Water Supply, Live Stock so that the residents of the small villages are benefited at their door step immediately.
